Rachel Aupperle

Level I (Recorder) and Level II (Movement)

Rachel Aupperle, M.S. '08, has been working with children in grades K–8 for the past seven years. She received her master's degree in music education from Illinois State University and her bachelor's degree in vocal music education from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. She has earned all three levels of Orff-Schulwerk certification. Aupperle has presented at the Illinois Music Educators Association (IMEA) District 3 Festival and to Illinois State Orff level courses. She has taught movement at the University of Wisconsin-Stevens Point and Illinois State University.

Vivian Murray Caputo

Level II (Basic Pedagogy and Recorder)

Vivian Murray Caputo is an Orff specialist who has taught in public and private schools for many years. Caputo has presented workshops for American Orff-Schulwerk Association (AOSA) chapters and for the Music Educators National Conference and AOSA national conferences. She has taught Levels I, II, and III Orff-Schulwerk teacher training courses at many universities. She served on the AOSA national board of trustees, as the AOSA Region 5 representative, and as co-chair of the 2005 AOSA National Conference in Birmingham, Alabama. She was co-chair of the international Orff symposium in Rochester, New York, in 2000. She has been an instructor for the International Association for Jazz Education teacher training institutes, and she sings with various jazz ensembles.

Susan Ramsay

Level I (Basic Pedagogy and Movement)

Susan Ramsay teaches music education courses at Belmont University, Middle Tennessee State University, and Vanderbilt University, after a career of more than 30 years in K–12 education. She has obtained Orff certification from the University of Memphis and Kodaly Certification from Belmont University, and is active as a presenter for music and classroom teachers. She codirects the Alleluia choir at Westminster Presbyterian Church in Nashville, Tennessee, and complements this with a busy schedule of performances as a storyteller and musician.
